## Message from Mr Shoultz



Winding down for summer? Not us!

I'm always surprised and amused when those not working in education say "It's June, so you must be winding down as a school!" In the last fortnight, we have had three theatre productions, as girls in Years 7 to 9 flexed their thespian muscles, several recitals, and sports fixtures aplenty. I was particularly delighted that the Year 7 and 8 Athletics team, having reached the Regional Finals of the school championships, came 2nd out of 24 teams across the whole South East region, a tremendous outcome.

Culture exploits continue apace, with our annual Fashion Show tomorrow evening, organised by our Year 12 Art Representatives, with a record 20 teams entering, and with rehearsals in progress for 'A Night at the Musicals' to round off the year. What is wonderful to see is the combination of excellence and opportunity, so that all girls can find a way to explore their interests. On Friday, I heard four of our strongest musicians having a 'dry run' recital for their Grade 8 and Diploma examinations, while yesterday I saw musicians of all experience levels performing pieces in an informal atrium concert, mixing "Darth Vader" on trumpet with soulful crooning to guitar accompaniment!

One of the great benefits of educational reform over the last decade has been the removal of modular A level (and GCSE) examinations. Year 12 students used to disappear for the heart of the summer term, and return understandably weary half way through June. By contrast, with no public exams, and internal examinations out of the way at the beginning of term, they have been able to keep pursuing their academic, cultural and sporting interests, including independent research and their leadership roles as representatives.

A busy and rich term, and still plenty of experiences to come before the summer break!
